Task Description:

Students will complete a Moodle skills quiz in their Forensic Archaeology period on Tuesday 9th April, 2024.

The skills quiz will take place in the technology centre. You need to have your Moodle log in and make sure you can access the year 10 Forensic Archaeology Moodle page. You will have 45 minutes to complete the exam.

Students will need to revise aspects of the course so far, including:

- The causes of the downfall of the Romanovs
- The evidence relating to the execution of the Romanovs
- The evidence supporting and disputing Anna Anderson as Anastasia Romanov
- All historical sources examined during the unit
- The year 10 Source Analysis Scaffold

The skills quiz will include:

- 30 multiple choice questions
- 1 short answer question (5 marks)
- 1 extended response (15 marks)

Details of Submission:

Students are expected to line up outside the technology centre for their Forensic Archaeology period on the 9/4/24.

You need to have your Moodle log in and make sure you can access the year 10 Forensic Archaeology Moodle page prior to the day.

The answers will save automatically, students need to press submit when they finish the quiz.

Absences on the day will be dealt with in accordance with school policies.

Assessment Procedures

How does this link to my learning?

- This task provides students with an opportunity to test their understanding of how historians construct a picture of the past using evidence such as primary and secondary sources.
- Students will demonstrate their understanding and knowledge of the pre-revolutionary Russia, the Romanov family, assassination and historical theories.
- Students will demonstrate their source analysis skills and literacy skills. Students should apply the concepts and historical terms studied in class to their responses.
