Task Description:

Section 1: Cities of Vesuvius – Pompeii and Herculaneum

- Short answer questions
- Short answer source-based questions
- Total marks: 25
- Allow 45 minutes for this section.

Section II: Ancient Societies - Spartan society to the Battle of Leuctra 371 BC

- Short answer questions
- Possible short answer source-based questions
- Total marks: 25
- Allow 45 minutes for this section.

Section III: Personalities in their times: Julius Caesar

- 1 x 5 mark question
- 2 x 10 mark question
- Possible source-based questions
- Total marks: 25
- Allow 45 minutes for this section.

Section IV: Historical Periods: The Fall of the Roman Republic 78–31 BC

- Choice of TWO essay style questions
- Possible source based questions
- Students choose ONE essay question to complete
- Total marks: 25
- Allow 45 minutes for this section.

Details of Submission:

- The task will be completed in exam conditions during the Trial HSC Examination Period.
- Students will have 3 hours to complete the examination, including 5 minutes reading time.
- Student must write using black or blue pen.
- Writing paper will be provided. Extra writing booklets are available.
- Students are NOT permitted to bring notes into the exam.

Absences on the day will be dealt with in accordance with school policies.

Assessment Procedures

Feedback provided

- The task will be typically returned to students within two school weeks of the submission date.
