### Task Description

Students will complete and submit a multiple choice assessment in class. This assessment will be made up of 20 questions which students will have 50 minutes to complete.

### Details of Submission

During the lesson allocated to the class, students will access the assessment task and submit the task at the end of the time allocated by the teacher. Once submitted, students will have no further access to this assessment.

### Teacher Feedback and Student Self-Reflection

- The task will typically be returned to students during the week starting with two weeks.
- At this time feedback including information on how to improve will be provided through written feedback as comments and allocated marks on the google classroom rubric for both parts of this task.
- Students can clarify or seek further feedback by speaking with their teacher or the assessment marker.
- You will also receive feedback on your literacy performance based on the criteria in the school's literacy marking rubric. The marks achieved for literacy will account for between 10% – 20% of the maximum task value.

Upon return of the task, students will also be expected to complete a self-reflection in the form of a digital form including the completion of a goal statement about how they will use their task to improve their learning.
