Task Description:

Students will complete a Moodle Skills Test in their Geography period on Wednesday, 23 October 2024. The skills test will take place in the Technology Centre or Visual Studio. Students will need to have their Moodle log in and make sure they can access the Year 8 Geography Moodle page prior to this date.

The skills test will include:

- Area and Grid Reference
- Elements of a map – BOLTSS
- Directions – Compass Rose
- Latitude and longitude
- Topographic maps – Contour lines, contour intervals and local relief
- Climate graphs

All questions are multiple choice. Each question is worth 1 mark each. Total mark is out of 40.

Details of Submission: The skills test will consist of 40 questions. Students will have 40 minutes to complete the task. Students are expected to line up outside the technology centre at the beginning of their scheduled Geography period on **Wednesday, 23 October 2024**

Students will need to have their Moodle log in and make sure they can access their Year 8 Geography Moodle page prior to the day. Students should bring a calculator and pen. Working out paper will be

provided if needed. During the test, student answers will be saved automatically. Students need to press submit when they finish the test.

Assessment Procedures

Feedback provided

- The task will be typically returned to students within two school weeks of the submission date.
