Details of Submission:

The task will be completed in exam conditions during the exam block on 18th August 2025. Students should consult their examination timetable to confirm the date and time of the exam.

Students must bring the necessary equipment for the examination, including ruler, black, red pens, pencil, eraser and a board approved calculator. Students are NOT permitted to bring their notes into the exam. Absences on the day will be dealt with in accordance with school policies. All writing paper will be provided.
